

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
ON ACADEMIC EXCHANGE
BETWEEN

The Simyeon Institute for North Korean Studies,
University of North Korean Studies, Republic of Korea

AND

International Institute for Cultural Studies,
Institute of Social Research and Cultural Studies,
International Master's Program in Inter-Asia Cultural Studies
National Chiao Tung University, Taiwan

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) applies to The Simyeon Institute for North Korean Studies, University of North Korean Studies, Republic of Korea and International Institute for Cultural Studies, Institute of Social Research and Cultural Studies (SRCS) International Master's Program in Inter-Asia Cultural Studies (IACS) National Chiao Tung University (NCTU) for the purpose of promoting academic exchange and further developing the cooperative relationship between the two institutions.

In consideration of mutual obligations below, the parties agree as follows:

1. Exchange of Academics, Research Personnel and Administrative Personnel
Both parties agree to dispatch academics, research personnel or administrative personnel to each other to participate in academic exchange activities and to explore possibilities of collaboration. The actual implementation of the academic exchange shall be negotiated separately between both parties.
2. Exchange of Students
Both parties agree to explore the possibility of student exchange. Any arrangement of student exchange shall be governed by a separate agreement on student exchange specifically signed for the purpose. The student exchange agreement may constitute a part of this MOU or may be signed independently.
3. Exploration of Teaching Collaboration
Both parties agree to explore the possibility of cooperation in offering degree programs and/or training courses. The actual implementation of collaborative projects shall be negotiated separately pursuant to the needs of both parties.
4. Scientific Research Collaboration
Both parties encourage scientific research collaboration in mutually interested research projects. The actual implementation of collaborative projects shall be negotiated separately pursuant to the needs of both parties.
5. Sharing of Joint Research Results
Results of any research achieved during the collaboration period (such as research

papers, developed samples, physical products, etc.) and attributable profits shall be shared among the parties concerned according to their agreed extent of contribution on the basis of consultation.


6. Exchange of Institutional Publications

Both parties will exchange institutional publications such as annual reports, research publications, etc.

7. Validity and Renewal

This MOU is made in a set of two. Each party will keep one copy. The MOU will take effect immediately once signed and is valid for FIVE (5) years. Both parties reserve the right to terminate this MOU by giving an advance written notice of no less than SIX (6) months. Both parties shall discuss and decide on the continuation or revision of the MOU SIX (6) months prior to its expiration.



Student Exchange Agreement
Between
The Simyeon Institute for North Korean Studies
University of North Korean Studies (UNKS), Republic of Korea
And
Institute of Social Research and Cultural Studies
International Master's Program in Inter-Asia Cultural Studies
National Chiao Tung University, Taiwan

Preamble:

In order to further strengthen the co-operation between the two parties we hereby agree to establish the following reciprocal student exchange program based upon principles of mutual benefit.

ARTICLE 1 Number of students and field of study

Each year during the term of this agreement, each party may exchange up to two [2] postgraduate students for one academic year of study (equivalent to four [4] semester slots) at the host university. Two (2) students for one (1) semester of study is equivalent to one (1) student for an academic year. The number of students may be modified from time to time by mutual agreement. It is understood that a balance in number of students exchanged shall be sought over a five-year period.

ARTICLE 2 Enrollment and duration of stay

Participating students under the terms of this agreement shall be enrolled as non-degree students at the host university. The duration of the students' stay shall not exceed twelve (12) months and not be below one (1) semester.

ARTICLE 3 Tuition and academic fees

Students participating in this exchange shall be exempt from paying tuition fee only to the host university. The host university will not be liable for travel, living, healthcare, insurance or other expenses incurred by the students. In addition, students shall pay any fees required of them by their home university in order to participate in the program.

ARTICLE 4 Language proficiency

Each party will in its selection procedure ensure that their students have adequate language proficiency to conduct studies at the host institution depending on the language the subjects are taught in.

ARTICLE 5 Admission criteria and the host university's right of rejection

Participating students seeking admission to the host university under the terms of this agreement shall meet the admission requirements of the host university. Each party reserves the right to reject candidates, in which case further candidates may be proposed. The parties will provide each other with adequate information on the performance of participating students.

ARTICLE 6 Rules and privileges

Students participating under the terms of this agreement shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the host university. They will also have the rights and privileges enjoyed by other full-time students at the host university, while they are on the exchange.

ARTICLE 7 Accommodation

Each party shall make every reasonable effort to assist students participating under the terms of this agreement in finding suitable accommodation. The payment of such housing together with the payment for all travel, medical insurance and subsistence cost shall be the responsibility of the individual students participating in the program and neither party shall be held liable for such charges. The selected students shall satisfy the home university that they have adequate funds for transportation to and from the home university and for subsistence during their stay.

ARTICLE 8 Activities for foreign students

Students participating under the terms of this exchange agreement shall be entitled to participate in any introductory courses or programs that may customarily be arranged for foreign students at the host university.

ARTICLE 9 Record and credits

Each party shall provide a record of subjects taken and grades received by each exchange student. Credit for subjects taken will be transferred at the discretion of the home university.

ARTICLE 10 Documents and certifications

Each exchange student is responsible for obtaining a visa and other related documents required for study at the host university. The host university shall provide incoming exchange students with any university certifications required to obtain a student visa for the full period of the exchange.

ARTICLE 11 Modification of agreement

This agreement may be modified by mutual written consent at any time.


ARTICLE 12 Duration, renewal and termination

The agreement shall take effect from the last signature for a period of five (5) years. Either party may, by notice in writing of no less than six (6) months, terminate this agreement. However, students who have commenced at either party before the date of termination may complete their courses of study.


